Service	Title	Description of Change
Proceeding Submission	Remove Incorrect Representative Role on EPS	A role of "Representative" was available for selection during new party registration that was incorrect. The system allowed representatives to register without a party to represent. This option for selection and the data has been corrected.
	Protective Markings on Transcripts	The AUC now has the ability to change the protective marking on transcripts based on whether or not the AUC has purchased the copyright and whether the transcript should be available to the public or just to registered parties. A court reporter can make a transcript submission and the appropriate protective marking is set based on the choice of the LAO.
	New Design format for Notifications	The New Involved Party Registered Notification, Registered Submission Notification, Proceeding Suspended Notification, and Application Disposition Notification have been redesigned to AUC standards.
	Document descriptions are now mandatory upon uploading.	All documents uploaded to the systems must now have a description.
	Label Buttons on Information Response Form	On the Information Response form, the buttons that label the Request Attachments and the Response Attachments have been changed to improve clarity of which attachment is being accessed.
	Non-BA DDS Self Registration	A member of the public can now self-register on the DDS system, create an account and manage a profile without obtaining a Business Associate identifier from the Petroleum Registry. This allows members of the public to register in a proceeding, create and download submissions, including documents with a protective marking of "Registered Parties". Previously, there was inequity between the BA users and the Non-BA users who were registered on a proceeding. The Non-BA users were unable to access the documents with a protective marking of "Registered Parties". DDS accounts have been created for non-BA participants currently involved on in-progress proceedings and their current submissions have been tied to the new account. A limit of 150 attachments per non-BA user per day has been added to the system.
Application Search, Digital Data Submission, Proceeding Search, Proceeding Submission	Participant List for Registered Parties	The registered parties list on the web is now available to other parties registered on a proceeding that have been authenticated through DDS. Members of the public are restricted from seeing the personal contact information detailed on this screen and are directed to info@auc.ab.ca to access this information.
	Notifications should not be sent to Suspended Parties	Once a party has been suspended from a proceeding, they will no longer receive any notifications pertaining to that proceeding.
