ENMAX Energy Corporation

2009-2011 Regulated Rate Option Non-Energy Tariff Application Including 2009 Final Rate Adjustments per the 2007-2008 RRO Non-Energy Negotiated Settlement (Rider Application – Appendix A & A-1)

Take Notice that ENMAX Energy Corporation (EEC) filed an application on March 1, 2010 with the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or Commission).

Nature of the Application

EEC requests approval of its final 2009-2011 Regulated Rate Option (RRO) Non-Energy Tariff Application. In the Application, EEC presents, among other things, its three-year site forecast, revenue requirement including margin and the resulting rates for residential customers and commercial customers.

Also included in the Application (introduced in Section 5.1) in Appendix A & A-1 is EEC's 2009 Final Rate Adjustment Rider Application per the 2007-2008 RRO Non-Energy Negotiated Settlement. EEC has attached this rider application in Appendix A and A-1. EEC requests that this rider application be dealt with separately from the 2009-2011 RRO Non-Energy Tariff Application and in an expedited manner.

Intervention in the Proceeding

Any party who wishes to intervene in this proceeding must submit a statement of intent to participate (SIP) to the Commission by the participation closing deadline of **2:00 p.m., March 30, 2010.**

The SIP should include the application number and the proceeding ID number in the subject line and set out the name of the party or organization name, address, telephone number and e-mail address (if available). The SIP submission must also contain a description of the nature of the party's interest in the proceeding (i.e. how the party will be affected by the Commission's decision); as well as provide an indication as to whether the party supports or objects to the application, and the supporting rationale.

If a party is represented by another party, the contact information for the representative should be included. If the SIP is being submitted on behalf of a group, the contact person for the group and the details on the group members should be provided. Submissions should be addressed to the AUC.

Subject to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, all documents filed in respect of a proceeding, including any documents filed prior to the start of a proceeding, must be placed on the public record. Your SIP letter and any other documents you file will be accessible to the public and all other participants in the proceeding through the Proceeding Search system on the AUC website. Please ensure that any document you file is free of information that you do not want to appear on a public record. If you do not want your document or part thereof placed on the public record, you must apply to the Commission under section 13 of the *AUC Rules of Practice* for a confidentiality order **before** you file your document.

AUC Procedures

Parties who do not register by filing a SIP will not receive further notice of the Commission's processing of this application.

If a submission is filed, the AUC may grant the application without a hearing, or any additional process, if:

- (a) the Commission considers the submission to be frivolous, vexatious or of little merit; or
- (b) the person filing the submission has not demonstrated that the person may be directly and adversely affected by a decision of the Commission on the proceeding.
