ENMAX No. 54 Substation and Interconnection Transmission Line

The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or the Commission) is a quasi-judicial regulatory body responsible for making decisions about utility-related applications, such as building transmission lines, substations and power plants.

ENMAX Power Corporation (ENMAX), in keeping with sections 14, 15 and 18 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, filed an application with the AUC on June 1, 2011. The application requests approval to construct and operate the No. 54 substation and connecting transmission line to reliably serve distribution system load growth in the area and to provide a back-up supply of electricity for critical services at the new South Calgary Health Campus in southeast Calgary.

The proposed project consists of three main components, namely:

- Construction of a new 138/25-kilovolt (kV) substation, designated as No. 54 substation, located adjacent to the Pine Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant facility in southeast Calgary (northwest of Deerfoot Trail and Township Road 221).
- Construction of approximately 6.4 kilometres of new double-circuit 138-kV transmission line designated as 138-32.82L and 138-26.81L between the proposed No. 54 substation and the corner of Deerfoot Trail and Marquis of Lorne Trail (Highway 22X).
- Restrung existing 138-kV transmission line 138-26.81 from ENMAX No. 26 substation to ENMAX No. 32 substation using larger conductors (wires).

On October 4, 2011, the Commission issued a notice of application for Application No. 1607374. In response to the notice, the Commission received submissions from three parties. Two parties subsequently withdrew their submissions.

The Commission has decided to establish a written hearing process for Application No. 1607374. This means there will be no oral hearing where parties are sworn in and asked questions through cross examination. All of the information the Commission will use to make its decision will be received by it in writing.

Participation in the written hearing:

Any person(s) that filed a submission in response to the original notice of application and still has an interest in, concerns about, or objections to the application has an opportunity to provide further information to supplement the information that has already been filed. Any further information outlining your concerns must be filed **by February 7, 2012**. If parties decide not to file additional information, the Commission will consider the information that is currently on the record.

After receiving all submissions in accordance with the schedule set out below, the Commission will consider all information filed in Proceeding ID No. 1258. The Commission will make a decision on the application, utilizing all submissions filed, as discussed above, without any further notice or process.

Any further submissions in support of your position should contain your name, street address, telephone number, email address and the proceeding ID number.

Submissions should be filed using the Digital Data Submission (DDS) system accessible from the electronic filing services ([e-filing services](#)) on our website (www.auc.ab.ca).
