

# Revised Notice of Application for Heisler 764S Substation Expansion and 144-kV Transmission Line in the Heisler area

The AUC issued a notice of application for this proceeding on February 1, 2012 with an error. Please note the corrected third bullet point under the *How to file a submission* section of this notice.

ATCO Electric Ltd. has filed a facility application to expand Heisler 764S substation and to construct a 144-kilovolt (kV) transmission line designated as 7LA701 in the Heisler area.

Anyone who objects, has concerns about, or supports the application, must make a written submission to the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) before **February 23, 2012** quoting **Proceeding ID No. 1650**.

## Information about the application

### ATCO Electric Ltd. Facility Application No. 1608020

ATCO, in accordance with sections 14, 15, 17 18, and 21 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, filed an application with the AUC on December 23, 2011 requesting approval to:

- Construct approximately 1.5 kilometres of single-circuit 144-kV transmission line designated as 7LA701. The new line would originate at Heisler 764S Substation and extend east to end at a tap point on 144-kV transmission line 7L701.
- Alter and relocate Heisler 764S Substation.
- Alter the Battle River to Strome 144-kV transmission line 7L701.
- Alter the Battle River to Heisler 72-kV transmission line 6L05.
- Connect the above-mentioned facilities to ATCO Electric's electrical system, and operate and maintain the noted transmission facilities.

Heisler 764S substation is located in LSD 4, Section 30, Township 42, Range 15, west of the Fourth Meridian. ATCO proposed to relocate the substation approximately 140 metres to the south and to expand the fenced area to 78 metres by 100 metres. The relocation will not affect the legal land description of the substation. ATCO proposed to add the following equipment to the substation:

- one 25/33-megavolt-ampere (MVA) 144/72/25-kV transformer
- one 6/8/10-MVA 72/25-kV transformer
- two 25/33-MVA 25-kV voltage regulators

- two 25-kV circuit breakers
- one 144-kV circuit breaker
- one 72-kV circuit breaker
- one self-supporting telecommunication tower
- one control building

In addition, ATCO proposed to remove the following equipment from the substation:

- one 10/13.3/16.6-MVA 144/72/25-kV transformer
- one 13-MVA 25-kV voltage regulator

Locations and routing of the above proposed facilities are shown on the map included in this notice.

### **Privacy:**

Please be aware that any statement or information provided to us about the applications are part of the public record, unless you apply for and are approved for an exemption by the AUC in advance of filing. Documents without specific personal information will be accessible to the

general public on the AUC website. If your documents contain personal information, that information will be redacted so that only individuals and organizations who register to participate in this proceeding will have access to your documents. If you do not want your documents placed on the public record, you must apply for a confidential ruling under Section 13 of AUC Rule 001: *Rules of Practice* before you file your document.

The AUC will only collect and use your personal information for the purposes of this proceeding. The AUC's legal authority to collect your personal information for this proceeding is Section 33(c) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.

### **AUC decision-making process:**

The AUC will ensure that the application is complete and will review submissions received. Those who have made submissions who have been determined by the Commission to have rights that may be directly and adversely affected by a decision on these application will be considered to have standing. If no submissions are received, or if submissions are received from persons without standing the AUC may *make a decision on the application* without further notice or without a public hearing. Alternatively, the Commission will hold a public hearing if it receives an objection from a person with standing and further details will be provided in a notice of hearing.
