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1 Introduction and background

1. On September 17, 2014, the Alberta Utilities Commission issued Decision [2014-265](#)¹ and Order [U2014-385](#),² designating the Redwater industrial complex as an industrial system pursuant to Section 4 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act* and providing an exemption from the operation of the *Electric Utilities Act* regarding the electric energy produced from and consumed by the proposed industrial system, pursuant to Section 117 of the *Electric Utilities Act*. The industrial complex is operated by Pembina NGL Corporation (Pembina), Williams Energy (Canada) Inc. and TransCanada Energy Ltd.

2. On January 27, 2015, Pembina, on behalf of Williams Energy (Canada) Inc. and TransCanada Energy Ltd., filed applications with the AUC seeking an amendment to the industrial system designation and Scoria 318S substation permit and licence in order to add new equipment to Scoria 318S substation at the industrial system site. The applications were approved on April 27, 2015, and the Commission issued Order [20115-D02-2015](#)³ and Permit and Licence [20115-D03-2015](#).⁴

3. On May 28, 2015, Pembina, on behalf of Williams Energy (Canada) Inc. and TransCanada Energy Ltd., filed applications with the AUC requesting an amendment to the existing Order 20115-D02-2015 and Permit and Licence 20115-D03-2015. The amendment was due to a typographic error throughout some of the application documents in Applications 20115-A001 and 20115-A002, which were consequently included in both the industrial system designation order and substation permit and licence.

4. The industrial system designation encompasses all facilities at the Redwater industrial complex. These facilities are located in Township 56, Range 22, west of the Fourth Meridian, in the Fort Saskatchewan area.

2 Discussion

5. Pembina stated that the typographic error was related to the proposed electrical infrastructure within Scoria 318S substation. The error consisted of an incorrect voltage of the proposed transformers that were to be added to Scoria 318S substation.

6. Pembina submitted that the typographic error was made inadvertently and had no significant impact to the proposed amendment to Scoria 318S substation.

3 Findings

7. The Commission has reviewed the applications and finds that the correction of the typographic error would have no material effect to the proposed amendment at the Redwater industrial system designation or Scoria 318S substation.

8. Based on the foregoing, the Commission considers the correction to be in the public interest in accordance with Section 17 of the *Alberta Utilities Commission Act*.

4 Decision

9. Pursuant to Section 4 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act* and sections 2(1)(d) and 117 of the *Electric Utilities Act*, the Commission approves Application 20484-A001 and grants to Pembina, Williams Energy (Canada) Inc., and TransCanada Energy Ltd. the approval set out in Appendix 1 – Industrial System Designation Order 20484-D02-2015 – June 17, 2015, to amend the Redwater industrial system designation. (Appendix 1 will be distributed separately).

10. Pursuant to sections 14, 15 and 19 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, the Commission approves Application 20484-A002 to alter and operate the substation and grants to Pembina the permit and licence set out in Appendix 2 — Substation Permit and Licence 20484-D03-2015 – June 17, 2015, to alter Scoria 318S substation (Appendix 2 will be distributed separately).
