# Applications for a 92.4 megawatt wind power project in the Municipal District of Wainwright/Irma area have been received

### Proceeding 22722 Applications 22722-A001

The Alberta Utilities Commission, the independent utilities regulator, will be considering the power plant development applications in Proceeding 22722. If you feel you may be affected by these applications you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

Irma Wind Limited Partnership, by its general partner, Irma Wind GP Inc., has applied to build and operate a 92.4 megawatt (MW) wind power project located in the Municipal District of Wainwright, under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*. Irma Wind GP Inc. is proposing 28 potential wind turbine locations and is considering two options for the final turbine locations. Option A consists of 27 of the 28 turbine locations and each would use a 3.4-MW turbine with a hub height of 110 metres and a rotor diameter of 140 metres. Option B consists of 22 of possible 24 turbine locations and each would use a 4.2-MW turbine with a hub height of 129 metres and a rotor diameter of 141 metres. The potential turbine locations are shown in the respective maps. The project will also consist of a collector substation and a 34.5-kilovolt primarily underground collector system. The project is located approximately 10 kilometres north of the village of Irma and 37 kilometres northwest of Wainwright across 6,700 acres of private lands. Specifically, the project area covers the following sections:

interest in the land, your business, or your activities which may be affected. Please briefly describe the issues you would like the AUC to consider when making its decision.

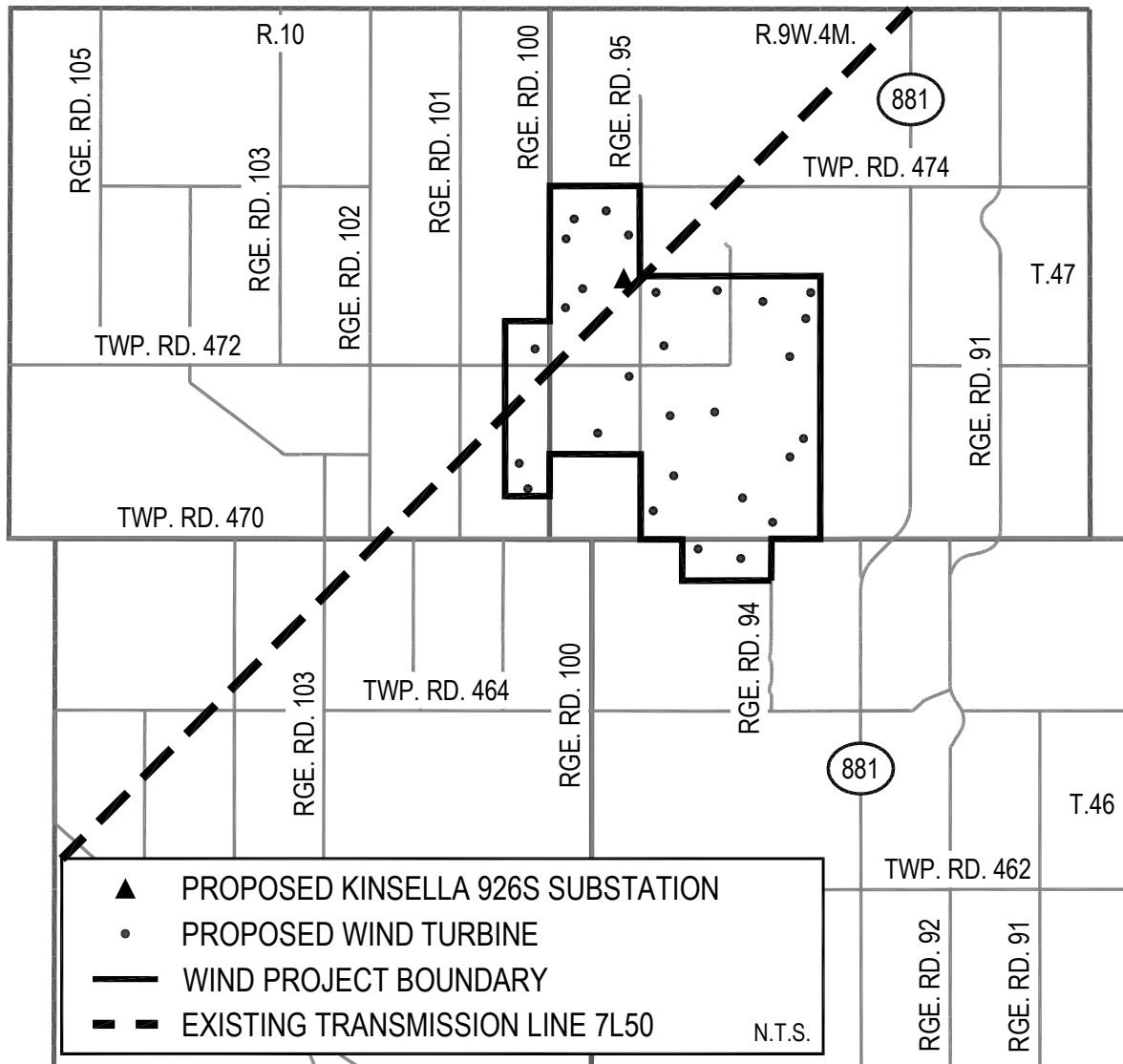
**Privacy**
