Application requesting approval for the Lanfine Wind Project buildable area near Oyen has been received

Proceeding 22736 Application 22736-A001

The Alberta Utilities Commission, the independent utilities regulator, will be considering the wind power plant development application in Proceeding 22736. If you feel you may be affected by this application you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

BowArk Energy Ltd. has applied for approval of a buildable area to locate a wind farm, named the Lanfine Wind Project, with a total capability of 290 megawatts, under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*. The applied for buildable area, as shown on the map, is located southwest of the town of Oyen within Special Area No. 3 and the Municipal District of Acadia.

Additional information about the application

BowArk Energy Ltd.'s application is a Phase 1 buildable area application, which means that it has applied for approval of the areas in which it proposes to construct the project. If the Phase 1 application were approved, BowArk Energy Ltd. would then need to apply, in a separate Phase 2 proceeding, for approval of the exact turbine type and locations and the collector substation location. For full application details visit the AUC website, log on to the eFiling System, enter the proceeding number and select go.

Written submissions are due September 11, 2017.
