

Notice of application Gas turbine generator addition at Cousins West site

The City of Medicine Hat has filed an application for a power plant alteration in the city of Medicine Hat

Application 24406-A001**

The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC), the independent utilities regulator, will be considering the power plant development application in Proceeding 24406. If you feel you may be affected by this application you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

Written submissions are due August 13, 2019.

The City of Medicine Hat has applied to add 44 megawatts (MW) of capacity to its Cousins West site by constructing a new simple-cycle gas combustion turbine generator, designated as CT17. The City of Medicine Hat also applied to connect CT17 to its distribution network.

The Cousins West site currently includes a 44-MW gas turbine, designated as CT16, and a 2-MW diesel black-start unit. The Cousins West site is located in the southeast quarter of Section 22, Township 13, Range 6, west of the Fourth Meridian, in the city of Medicine Hat. The location of the site is shown on the attached map. The application has been filed under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*.
