

# Notice of applications Lanfine Wind Power Project

## Pattern Development Lanfine Wind ULC has filed applications for the Lanfine Wind Power Project in the Oyen area

### **Proceeding 22736 Applications 22736-A001 to 22736-A005**

The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC), the independent utilities regulator, will be considering the power plant development applications in Proceeding 22736. If you feel you may be affected by these applications you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

**If you have previously filed a submission in this proceeding, please provide an update on whether your concerns have been addressed or remain outstanding.**

### **Written submissions are due April 9, 2019.**

The Commission previously issued a notice of application on August 10, 2017, for the buildable area of the Lanfine Wind Power Project (the project). Pattern Development Lanfine Wind ULC subsequently acquired the project from Bowark Energy Ltd. and filed additional applications in which it applied to construct, operate and interconnect the project. The applications were filed under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*.

Pattern Development Lanfine Wind ULC stated that the project would consist of a 284.4-megawatt wind power plant, two collector substations, designated as Buffalo Bird 601S Substation and Nighthawk Substation, a collector system, access roads, permanent meteorological towers and an operations and maintenance facility. The wind power plant would consist of 79 turbines, each approximately 105 metres high with a rotor diameter of 136 metres.

The project would be located southwest of Oyen in Special Area No. 3 and Municipal District of Acadia No. 34, within townships 25 to 27 and ranges 3 to 5, west of the Fourth Meridian. Please refer to the attached map for additional details.
